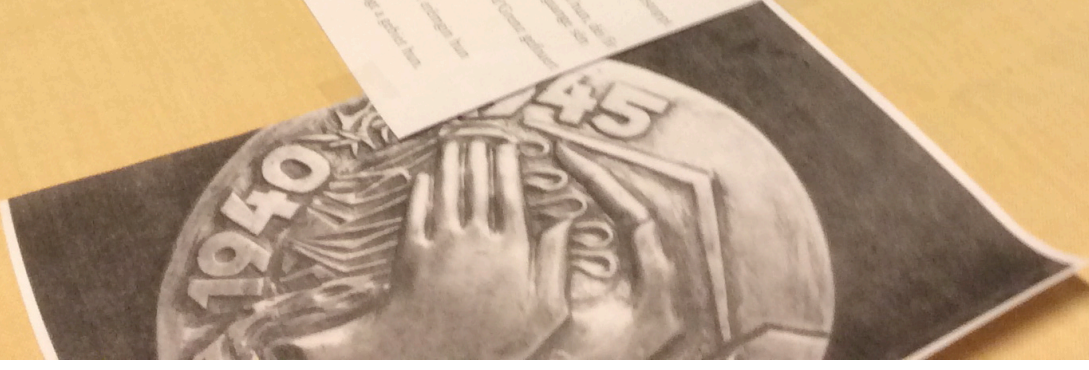

Acknowledging your letter of October 15th, and I am very grateful for your reply and interest in getting my son's body back to me.

I am giving you the following information, and I sincerely hope that you will do your utmost in speeding his body back to me, as that is my one hope, to live to see his body interred in our family lot.

Pfc. Max Berlin, 36705396, 328th Inf. 26th Division, his body was buried at United States Military Cemetery, Linzy, France, Plot B, Row 7, Grave 156.

This is all of the information, that I have been able to get from the War Department.

As I have told you and written in previous letters, I would be willing and glad to pay the expenses of bringing the body back, if it would speed the matter up any, as I do not know how long I am going to be here, and I certainly want to be here when the body is brought back.

So please do not spare my expense in rushing the matter.

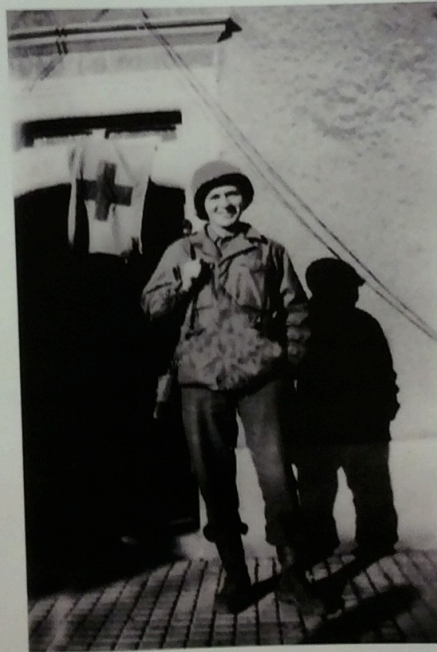
